



The Great Australian Bike Ride calls in to Rosedale

The Great Australian Bike Ride has been on the road since 21 March when four cyclists left Melbourne on a journey around Australia to raise funds for, and awareness of, the research into mental illness.

The plan is to complete the journey, which is supported by Australian Rotary Health, within six months. Other cyclists join the group along the way, cycling for a section or two, helping to raise funds.

They ride 100-140kms a day and are calling in at as many communities, and Rotary Clubs, as possible.

They are currently on the Townsville to Darwin trek, but, on a Wednesday in early May, the group cycled in to Rosedale and enjoyed a morning at the Rosedale Market.
