



# Top trailer in town

**The Rotary Club of Waikerie and the wider community now have access to a specially designed and custom built catering trailer for community events.**

Waikerie Rotarian Richard Hall instigated the idea of constructing a purpose-built trailer a couple of years ago – a project that's now been completed.

“We wanted to create something that the whole community could benefit from,” Mr Hall said.

“So I drew up the plans and we got started on construction and trying to find sponsorship and donations.”

The trailer cost Rotary \$4000 in parts and materials, and the club also received about \$1000 worth of donations from steel material companies and Waikerie Tyre and Mag Centre.

“We're thankful for the support we had from the community and these community and business

contributions will be recognised on a plaque to be installed on the trailer,” Mr Hall said.

The trailer is equipped with two full sized barbecue plates, gas bottles, full stainless steel kitchen with sink and urn, water tank and grey water tank, storage for trestles, ice chests and food containers.

Mr Hall said the trailer will be used by Rotary for a variety of catering purposes.

“It'll be used for events such as the Australia Day Extravaganza, Food Fair and the Christmas Pageant,” he said.

“(The trailer) is not for general hire – it's for community use and can be used by community members and groups as long as there's a Rotarian present.”

The trailer has already been put to good use, being used to help cater for the participants in the Great Australian Bike Ride, which passed through Waikerie last week.
