



Aussie bike ride rolls on

BIKERS on a fundraising mission will roll through the Camden Haven on Friday.

About 30 cyclists taking part in the Great Australian Bike Ride will arrive in Laurieton as part of the charitable and epic journey.

The 18,000km ride around the country was organised by Australian Rotary Health aiming to raise \$1 million for mental health issues.

Hundreds of cyclists put their pedals in

motion on March 21 in Melbourne.

Dozens of dedicated riders will pass through Laurieton and Bonny Hills on Friday doing their "leg" for the cause.

Rotary Club of Laurieton will welcome the riders with a morning tea on North Brother Mountain.

They will then cycle through Bold St between 11 and 11.30am.

Residents can cheer on the cyclists before they ride to Bonny Hills

Conference Centre to join the RYLA (Rotary Youth Leadership Award) group for lunch.

Cyclists will arrive in Port Macquarie in the afternoon.

After a day's rest on Saturday, Anzac Day, they will depart Port Macquarie on Sunday.

They will then travel through Wauchope and Kempsey to South West Rocks.
